## **ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY**

Magadh University, located in the vicinity of Bodh Gaya, the Holy seat of Lord Buddha' s enlightenment, is one of the largest Universities in Bihar spread across the districts of Gaya, Nawada, Jehanabad, Arwal and Aurnagabad. It consists of 19 Constituent Colleges, 39 Affiliated Colleges and 2 Law Colleges. It is the brainchild of Shri Satyendra Narayan Singh, an eminent educationist who initially became the Education Minister and later served as the Chief Minister of unified Bihar. It was established on 1<sup>st</sup> March 1962 and Prof. Kali Kinkar Dutta, an academician and historian of International repute, was appointed as the first Vice Chancellor. Noted academic administrator Dr. Keshav Prasad Singh became the first Registrar. Initially, the University was located in Gaya Town; but later at the behest of the then Education Minister Shri Satyendra Narayan Singh, the Mahant of Bodh Gaya math Shri Satanand Giri donated a huge tract of land. It was here that the foundation stone for the present campus was laid by the presiding President of India, Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan on 20<sup>th</sup> August, 1964. Since then, the University became a prominent seat of learning and excelled in various fields. Today, Magadh University offers courses in more than 26 subjects at Under-Graduate, Post-Graduate and Research level across the faculties of Social Science, Humanities, Science and Commerce. Along with these, the University runs a number of vocational courses like Journalism and Mass Communication, Library Science, Environmental Science, Hotel Hospitality and Tourism Management, Rural Development Management, Education, Foreign Languages etc.
